# 2024 SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Financial support provided by parents plays a significant role in extending the school's capacity to add value to the learning experiences of our students. This support is provided in the form of:

- 1. Voluntary Contributions
- 2. Items for Personal Use Items
- 3. Charges for Extra Cost Optional Components of the learning program
- 4. Other Approved Voluntary Requests
- 5. The school's Pay It Forward program

The Mount Hawthorn Primary Schools Board has endorsed this schedule of contributions and charges for 2024 which aligns with the *School Education Regulations 2000* as part of the *School Education Act 1999*.

### PART 1 – VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

Voluntary Contributions are used towards the cost of resources used by students in the educational program and represent an important revenue source. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of our program in all curricular areas is enhanced when all families contribute.

The total voluntary contribution amount per child sought is \$60.

#### Payment:

Voluntary contributions can be paid in one of three ways:

#### PART 2 - ITEMS FOR PERSONAL USE

These are items that a student requires to fully participate in the learning activities. The list of items will vary by student and includes those:

- Required by all students and used in lessons, e.g. stationery items, calculator, etc.
- Recommended for all students, e.g. art shirt, tissues, etc.
- Required for selected students, e.g. musical instruments.

Some items, such as calculators and headphones, may be used in successive years. Other items, such as pens, pencils, glue, may need to be replenished throughout the year. A list of recommended items, informally termed the "booklist", is provided for each child. Parents may purchase the items from any retailer or use the school's nominated supplier, Campion Education. Campion Education pays a commission to the school on items purchased through the Back-to-School program.

### PART 3 – CHARGES FOR EXTRA COST OPTIONAL COMPONENTS

Estimated charges for your child's participation in excursions, incursions, and activities are listed below. Students will *only* incur costs when they are involved in an activity. The charges represent a <u>maximum</u> for the scheduled activities. Parents will be advised of actual charges for their student when payment is due.
